

SWAP, as a not-for-profit partnership of 24 public sector bodies, is well aware of the increasing challenge faced by heads of internal audit to add value and improve the level of assurance provided against a background of diminishing resources and ever-increasing expectations of stakeholders.

In this time of unprecedented change, the Combined Assurance and Healthy Organisation Review was born as a means to clarify the following for senior management and the audit committee regarding their essential corporate functions:

- critical areas where assurance or process could be improved,
- critical areas where the control environment is strong (and potential savings could be made).

Drawing on the concept of Combined Assurance, the review is carried out jointly by senior management and internal audit together either as a strategic overview, or a deep dive into service provision. It is a health check on eight essential corporate functions which underpin day to day operational activities derived from work by the West of England chief internal auditors and drawing on CIPFA and IIA material. These corporate functions are:

- corporate governance
- financial management
- risk management
- performance management
- commissioning and procurement
- information management
- programme and project management
- people and asset management

- Members, officers and internal auditors are more informed (a clear line of sight) on the organisation's assurance arrangements

- Ability to benchmark performance and share good practice with others adopting the approach
